We travelled by boat to Lauro Saudré, an Indian tribe, where we would like to help Pastor Nestor finish the construction of their church.

What a delight to visit Corina, Pr. Edgar's wife from Islândia, Peru, and her preschool class! Islândia is considered a place of extreme poverty. They don't have potable water and many of these children don't have a decent meal. Corina decided to do something about it and opened a school in her home. The team confirmed the need to build a kitchen and bathroom on the side of their house with the possibility of expanding this ministry to other locations in the city.



Corina is a hard worker, incredibly creative and has a passion for the Lord and for children. She makes her visuals, classroom toys and educational materials like instruments, etc. out of recycled materials. What a delight to work side by side with her to make these animal masks. She made one set as a teaching tool and I made a set for the big event we will have here in Benjamin for Children's Day, October 12<sup>th</sup>. See for yourself... 😊



We ministered in another school that is 20 min. away by car, but for much of the year the people in this small community don't have much access to the town. One of the school teachers, Elina, comes to town on weekends for church since they have none. The children in her school often ask her what is a church and what it's like. In rainy

season the small dirt road is impassible, even for motorcycles. Sometimes it takes three hours one way to walk to town for church! There is already a possibility of acquiring a piece of land and constructing a congregation in this community.

In between flights, Wilson is coordinating and working on projects on the land where our flight base will be. They dug holes for a fence, laid a concrete base for the container that will serve as our office and shop and are building a small wall for the foundation and floor of the hangar. The days are sunny and HOT, but Wilson always says that here in the Amazon we sweat for JESUS!



When Wilson and I took the team to the airport, we were so excited to see the two little Indian boys that Wilson did emergency flights for. Both had their leg amputated and were on their way to São Paulo to be fitted with prosthesis and have 6 mo. of physical therapy!

God blesses us and blesses all these people through you. Thank you for your partnership!
